January Speaker Rafael B. Cruz

Rafael Cruz is the father of Texas Senator Ted Cruz and has an amazing story of pursuing the American Dream. Born in Cuba, Rafael lived and suffered under a cruel, oppressive dictator. As a teenager he fought Batista's regime and was imprisoned and tortured simply because he wanted to be free.
