- 8. 2nd Place PRIZE is a lovely Kendra Scott bracelet. (I'll bring it to the 2/5 meeting)



Legislative Report

A couple of important bills have been submitted in the current legislature. For more information on these and other bills submitted, go to our website <u>clearcreekrw.org</u> and click on TX Legislature.

House Bill 899 to limit disaster powers and stop state agencies from fining, suspending or revoking occupational licenses (or licenses to operate) based solely on the violation of a disaster order. This is a critical safeguard for small businesses and people's ability to make a living and feed their family. State agencies, such as the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) have threatened many with 30-day shutdowns and even revoked licenses to operate, which has forced many out of business for good.

Bill 574 relates to preventing election fraud.

According to the proposed bill, it would be considered a second-degree felony, not a misdemeanor, for a person to knowingly commit election fraud.

On August 26,1920 the 19th amendment was adopted. The 19th amendment secured a women's right to vote.
