Legislative Report

The last week of January Mayes Middleton filed a slate of bills in his continuing effort to deliver property tax reform and relief to taxpayers.

HB 1391 temporarily freezes property taxing entities' ability to raise taxes if a proposed tax increase fails at the ballot box.

HB 1392 increases the maximum amount of the local option residence homestead exemption from property taxation in Galveston and Chambers counties.

HB 1393 increases the maximum amount of the local option residence homestead exemption from property taxation in Texas.

HB 1395 reforms appraisal districts, eliminates business personal property taxes, and sets the appraised taxable value of certain property, including single-family residential, small income producing properties, and raw land, at the price paid.

Many of these bills could provide local entities and citizens, tools to enhance the homestead exemption and place limitations on appraisal value increases.

The Texas senate began redistricting hearings, however the data necessary to draw new boundary lines for state house and congressional districts, will not be available before the end of July. This will cause a special session on redistricting for the Legislature. In a normal census year, reapportionment data is delivered before the end of that year, but because of the pandemic, legal challenges, and storms over the summer there have been many delays. Early estimates indicate that Texas added four million to total population since 2010, and the state should see three new seats in Congress, but we will not know for sure for several months.

A bill has been submitted to require the playing of the National Anthem at sporting events in Texas.
