CCR Women, Happy New Year! Without further ado...

United States

SCOTUS:

- Docket 22-380 Raland J. Brunson, Petitioner v. Alma S. Adams, et al. Regarding Congressional violation of Constitutional Oaths pertaining to, 01-06-21. This case will have significant far-reaching implications if Brunson prevails. The general conference of Justices for 22-380 is currently scheduled for, 01-06-23 (Docket search for 22-380: Search Supreme Court of the United States, click on 'Petition' to read the complete filed 18-page writ of certiorari).
- Chief Justice Roberts temporarily blocked Biden's attempt to end the Trump-era border policy after 19 Republican states (including TX) filed an emergency request with SCOTUS to uphold the Trump-era Title 42 Policy (12-19-22, thegatewaypundit.com).

LAME DUCK:

Legislation passed by the lame duck Congress could significantly impact the leverage Congressional Republicans have in the new 118th Congress which convenes, 01-03-23. Key legislation includes:

- Raising the Debt Ceiling
- Omnibus Spending Bill (approximately 1.7 trillion + \$800 billion to finance + 2.5 trillion for Medicare/ Medicaid/Social Security = \$5 trillion); plus tagged onto the omnibus is the...
- Electoral Count Reform and Presidential Transition Improvement Act of 2022 which seeks to change the Electoral Count Act of 1887. Per Senator Cruz, "I don't believe senators from this side of the aisle should be supporting a bill that enhances the federalization of elections and reduces the ability of Congress to respond to the very serious problem of voter fraud. I think this bill does that, and so I intend to oppose it." (See full article at Sen. Cruz Opposes Electoral Count Reform Act for Reducing Congressional Ability to Address Voter Fraud | Senator Ted Cruz (senate.gov)
- National Defense Authorization Act, the annual military funding bill, was signed by the House and Senate and most likely will be signed by Joe Biden. While the majority of military personnel have received the C-19 vaccine, this act repeals the military C-19 vaccine mandate
- Respect for Marriage Act was signed into law on, 12-13-22, repeals the 1996 Defense of Marriage Act and orders the recognition of same-sex marriages (congress.gov; warroom.org; townhall.com; thehill.com, dailysignal.com)

- 1) House Speaker selection,
- 2) National Republican Party chair selection,
- 3) Border invasion and ending Title 42,
- 4) Illegal use of Twitter/etc. to squelch conservative speech prior to the 2020 General Election by government entities (including FBI), big-tech, corporations, etc.



Legislative Report—January 2023

TEXAS

<u>The 88th TX Legislature convenes, 01-10-23</u>. Legislation pre-filing began, 11-04-22. The 140th and final day of the 88th regular legislative session, known as "Sine Die", is 05-29-23.

TX Republican Party Legislative Priorities for the 88th Session (2023-2024) of the Texas Legislature, as chosen by the voting delegates at the state convention in June, 2022 are: 1) Protect our Elections, 2) Secure the Border and Protect Texans, 3) Ban Gender Modification of Children, 4) Stop Sexualizing Texas Kids, 5) Ban Democrat Chairs, 6) Abolish Abortion in Texas, 7) Defend Our Gun Rights, and 8) Parental Rights and Educational Freedom. 1364 Bills Filed in Dec 2022 Address Issues Including: ELECTIONS AND VOTING SYSTEMS, IMMIGRATION REFORM, THE TX BORDER, HUMAN TRAFFICKING, ORGANIZED CRIME, BORDER PATROL AGENTS, CONSTRUCTION BUILDING MATERIALS & HEAVY EQUIPMENT, CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS, FEDERAL & INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS, POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS, FINANCIALS, ABORTION, PARENTAL RIGHTS, EDUCATION, HEALTH, and GENDER IDENTITY & EXPRESSION. This list will change as legislation is introduced and progresses.

TX 88th, Certain Notable Legislation Highlights:

- ♦ SB 147 addresses purchase or acquisition of title to real property by aliens or foreign entities.
- ♦ SB 237 & HB 82 address an interstate compact on border security and immigration enforcement. Excerpt: "... detection and apprehension or deflection of illegal aliens attempting to cross the border into this state; and (2) any other enforcement of federal immigration laws, including the detecting, apprehending, detaining, prosecuting, releasing, and monitoring of illegal aliens."
- ♦ TX SD11 Senator Elect Mayes Middleton filed 4 Senate bills between, 11-14-22 and 12-15-22: <u>SB 175</u> seeks to ban taxpayer-funded lobbying, <u>SB 176</u> starts to lay the groundwork for school choice, <u>SB 177</u> addresses the requirement of informed consent before providing certain medical treatments and <u>SB 242</u> addresses the identification of and prohibited cooperation by state and local entities with certain federal acts that violate the United States Constitution.
- ◆ TX House District 23 Rep Elect Terri Leo Wilson filed 9 House bills between, 11-14-22 and 12-15-22: HB's 434, 439, 571, 574, 575, 577, 646, 983 and 1022. HB 571 would repeal the affirmative defense to prosecution for criminals selling, distributing, or displaying harmful material to minors. An affirmative defense typically is based on facts other than those that support the plaintiff's claim with the potential to excuse the defendant from civil or criminal liability, wholly or partly, despite the allegations being true. HB 577 would repeal or limit certain state and local taxes, including school district maintenance and operations ad valorem taxes, and enact state and local value added taxes and related school finance reform.

Legislation-Related News:

- 1) Vaccine Mandate: On, 12-20-22, Attorney General Paxton joined a 22-state petition sent to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) opposing the draconian federal health care system's vaccine mandate. Per the Texas Freedom Caucus (freedomfortexas.com). Texas law protects your right to opt-out of vaccine schedules. For opt-out details visit TX Department of State Health Services (DSHS) website exemption page at Texas Immunization Exemptions Texas DSHS.
- 2) TX Border Wall: The Texas-Mexico border is 1,254 miles long of which 1,000 miles has no barrier. The federal government halted construction of the southern U.S. border wall, 01-2021. 41+ Texas counties have officially declared a border invasion. Texas Facilities Commission (TFC), a state agency with less than 400 people, has assumed the role previously performed by the Army Corp of Engineers (with approximately 37,000 personnel) to solicit, contract, engineer, and construct a permanent wall along the Texas-Mexico border. From 07-2021 to 07-2022, TFC hired a program manager and design-build contractor and completed the first 1.7 mi segment of the wall. The security mission of the program is led by TX DPS which has identified about 40 miles of highest priority to secure the border. The next segments of the border wall will be on private land, requiring the State to contract for the right-of-way easements which is a detailed legal process. Land Agents are contacting and working with about 150 landowners to secure land-use permission agreements. Campaign Activities—January 2023

4th Quarter October—December Reporting



It is time to submit your 4th quarter Volunteer hours for 2022.

Please log in and send them by NOON SATURDAY January 7, 2023!

Look at your calendars/phones and include any additional hours that you might not have previously reported for the past and current quarters. If you have not reported your volunteer hours this year at all, now is the time to add them all up and send them in. With the new changes, we may now include hours worked as election clerks, election judges, making phone calls and time spent working for candidates as long as you are not employed by them. Don't forget your travel time to and from events, and any preparations for those meetings or events. Our Galveston County GOP Headquarters has been open and will be reopening again soon just a few offices down. Please don't forget to volunteer and keep a record of your hours spent. Awards will be given by TFRW and NFRW to members and clubs reporting the most hours.

As a reminder...New Categories for Reporting Hours and what to include:

1. CALLING

Include all calls for any political activities, such as initiatives or ballot questions.

Dialing apps will record the number of calls you have made, or you can use your best estimate.

2. POLITICAL HOURS

When in doubt, count the hour and round up to the closest whole hour.

Travel time to and from the activity.

Research and development of the activity (Example: Social media posts / letters to the editor).

Preparation and breakdown of activity hours collected are on a best estimate basis.

3. PRIMARY and ASSOCIATE MEMBERS hours are counted.

All volunteer political activities, whether paid or unpaid (Example: paid election worker or poll watcher), are eligible. *Individuals who are salaried campaign and/or GOP professional staff do not qualify (i.e., those who earn their living by being employed in politics).

EXAMPLES OF ACTIVITIES

- All time spent at Club, Region, State, and National Federation meetings or conventions (in person or virtual).
- ♦ All campaign activities benefiting the Federation (TFRW), the Republican Party, or Republican candidates.
- ♦ Attendance at all Republican events, including Rallies, Lincoln Day Dinners, even if tickets were purchased for attendance.
- Running for Office (partisan or non-partisan) as a Republican Candidate.
- Walking precincts, preparing letters to the editor or elected officials, any phone calls, radio, TV and social media appearances, posting to social media, voter registration, writing or editing a digital or hardcopy club newsletter, attendance at rallies.
- ♦ Working on any aspect of a Republican campaign (partisan or non-partisan) .
- ♦ Working on Republican ballot questions, initiatives, or petitions.
- ♦ Time spent serving as an elected member of your Local, County, State or National Party Committee.
- ♦ Attending, preparing for, or volunteering at Club, Region, State, and National Federation meetings or conventions.
- ♦ Attending, preparing for, or volunteering at meetings or conventions of the Local, County, State, and National Republican Party or local meetings or conventions.
- ♦ Working at a Local, County, State, National Republican office.
- ♦ Working at a Local, County, State, National Republican candidate or elected official's office as a volunteer.
- ♦ Working as an Election Officer, Poll Watcher, Challenger, or Election Integrity worker.
- ♦ All campaign activities benefiting our Republican Party, candidates, and/or the Federation (TFRW).
- ♦ Time spent making political and campaign calls.
- ♦ Any other political or campaign activities.
















2022 Texas GOP Priorities

These priorities were chosen by over 5,000 voting delegates at the state convention, June 13-18, 2022 in Houston, Texas. Delegates were presented with a <u>list of 15 topics selected by the Legislative Priorities Committee</u> after a comprehensive review of resolutions passed at the precinct and senate district levels of the convention process. Delegates were allowed to vote on 8 topics, which became the official Legislative Priorities of the Republican Party of Texas.

1. Protect our Elections:

Restore felony penalties and enact civil penalties for Election Code violations, which shall be enforceable by any Texas jurisdiction, including the Texas Attorney General. Require citizenship verification of each voter. Restrict the distribution of mail-in ballots to only disabled, military, and citizens that are out of state. Reduce the time allowed for early voting, and eliminate the three-day gap between early voting and election day. Establish closed primaries in Texas. As technology evolves, we encourage the passage of legislation that ensures the security of our elections.

2. Secure the Border and Protect Texans:

Texas shall immediately deny all taxpayer funded services and subsidies to illegal aliens. We call upon the Governor to assert his duty under Article 1, Section 10, Clause 3 of the US Constitution to declare an invasion on our Texas border and do everything in his power to protect Texans from this invasion. The legislature shall direct the Governor to enter into an Interstate Compact with one or more states for Border Security.

3. Ban Gender Modification of Children:

Texas must ban chemical castration, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, genital mutilation, bodily alteration surgery, psychological/social transitioning, and any other methods applied to or performed on children.

4. Stop Sexualizing Texas Kids:

Repeal Texas Penal Code "Obscenity Exemption" 43.24(c), which allows children access to harmful, explicit, or pornographic materials and 43.25(f)(2 3), which allows sexual performance by a child. In addition, prohibit teaching, exposure, and/or discussion of sexual matters (mechanics, feelings, orientation, or "gender identity" issues), and prohibit use or provision of related books and other materials using criminal, civil or other enforcement measures.

5. Ban Democrat Chairs:

To ensure all legislative Republican priorities are given a fair opportunity to become law, the Republican-controlled Texas legislature shall adopt a rule that would end the practice of awarding committee chairmanships to Democrats.

6. Abolish Abortion in Texas:

Abolish abortion by ensuring the right to life and equal protection of the laws to all preborn children from the moment of fertilization, including adopting effective tools to ensure the enforcement of our laws to protect life when district attorneys fail to do so.

7. Defend Our Gun Rights:

Protect our gun rights against threats, such as red flag laws, federal, state or other restrictions, by strengthening and preserving our inalienable rights under the second amendment to protect our life, liberty and property. The Texas Legislature should eliminate gun-free zones.

8. Parental Rights and Educational Freedom:

Parents are the primary decision makers for their children in all matters. This authority shall be protected as an inalienable right. This shall include the choice of schooling where the money follows the child without strings attached, and enforcement and penalty mechanisms when parents' rights are violated. The right to education shall be free from any social theories.
