SCOTUS:

• 01-09-23, denied the petition for Docket 22-380 Raland J. Brunson, Petitioner v. Alma S. Adams, et al., regarding Congressional violation of Constitutional Oaths pertaining to, 01-06-21. Brunson will appeal.

NEW 118TH U.S. CONGRESS – convened 01-03-23.

- Here are the 21 House Republicans who stood firm and secured major rules changes by which the House will limit its own powers and carry out its agenda while remaining responsive to We the People: <u>Andy Biggs-AZ5, Dan Bishop-NC8, Lauren Boebert-CO3, Michael Cloud-TX27, Andrew Clyde-GA9, Byron Donalds-FL19, Matt Gaetz-FL1, Bob Good-VA5, Paul Gosar-AZ9, Andy Harris-MD1, Mary Miller -IL15, <u>Ralph Norman-SC5, Scott Perry-PA10, Matt Rosendale-MT2, Chip Roy-TX21, Victoria Spartz-</u> IN5; and newly-elected, Josh Brecheen-OK2, <u>Eli Crane-AZ2, Andy Ogles-TN5, Anna Paulina Luna-FL13</u> and <u>Keith Self-TX3</u>.

 - **Rule changes include: 1) Requiring a 72-hour period for reading of bills, 2) Ending the practice of huge omnibus spending bills,** and **3) Restoring** the rule permitting any member of the House majority party (i.e. privileged) at any time to propose a "**motion to vacate**" the speaker's chair necessitating a full House vote on whether or not to retain the speaker; this rule was used in 1910 and 2015 but was amended in 2019 by Democrats so that motions to vacate were only privileged if offered by direction of a party caucus or conference.

118th House Action Items include:

- Establish a new Judiciary Committee (Church II) subcommittee to investigate executive branch misuse of power, including abuses by the FBI and DOJ against political opponents
- Establish a committee to investigate Chinese Communist Party (CCP) influence in the United States

TEXAS

The 88th TX Legislature convened 01-10-2023

Republican Dade Phelan was re-elected TX House Speaker receiving bipartisan support of 145-3. Legislative priorities include the border, schools & the state's \$30 billion budget surplus resulting from sales taxes.

Gov. Abbott and Lt. Gov. Patrick are advocating for:

1) property tax relief including raising the homestead exemption form \$40K to \$60K and cutting business taxes by increasing the personal property exemption;

2) electric grid reliability by building more natural gas power plants; and

3) border security and law enforcement including a rural law enforcement fund and enhancing sheriff pay. Also, they want U of H and TX Tech to be able to receive funds from the TX Permanent University Fund from which they heretofore have been excluded, unlike UT and A&M. Speaker Phelan advocates the budget surplus should primarily address state infrastructure including the power grid, roads, high speed internet, water, and drainage projects. (www.reformaustin.org)

TX Freedom Caucus (TFC):

18 of the 21 U.S. House Republicans who secured major wins for We the People during Speaker selection were members of the **Freedom Caucus**. Texas has its own House Freedom Caucus. TFC was established in 2017 to, "... amplify the voice of liberty-minded, grassroots Texans who want bold action to protect life, strengthen families, defend the U.S. and Texas Bills of Rights, restrain government, and revitalize personal and economic freedoms in the State of Texas." Of 150 TX House representatives, 12 are TFC members, including the following four newly elected members as of the 2022 midterm election: Rep **Terri Leo-Wilson** (HD 23), Rep **Richard Hayes** (HD 57), Rep **Carrie Isaac** (HD 73) and Rep **Nate Schatzline** (HD 93). The TFC stated mission echoes the TX Republican Party Legislative Priorities for the 23/24 88th Session of the TX Legislature as established by the voting delegates at the TX Republican Party state convention in June, 2022. (freedomfortexas.com)

TX Border Wall: (See CCRW 1/2023 Newsletter for more info):

Gov. Abbott launched Operation Lone Star (OLS) 3/2021 to secure the TX border by doing what, "...the Biden administration has refused to do." He issued a disaster declaration now covering 48 counties mostly along the border and directing DPS to, "... use available resources to enforce all applicable federal and state laws to prevent the criminal activity along the border, including criminal trespassing, smuggling, and human trafficking..." The cost is estimated at \$2 million/week. Abbott states OLS has apprehended 300,000+ migrants and taken 345 million+ doses of fentanyl off the streets. According to Maj. Gen. Thomas M. Suelzer, TX Adjutant General & head of the TX Military Department, "Texas is experiencing historic levels of illegal crossings." As of 01-2023 the TX National Guard expanded OLS to El Paso in response to the unprecedented number of illegal border crossings there. Also, TX DPS developed the tactic of using drones in conjunction with groups of elite soldiers from the TX National Guard called "brush teams" to locate illegal immigrants. The teams use the information provided from the drones equipped with night vision and thermal cameras to locate and arrest trespassing migrants in unforgiving terrain. 1st Lt. Austin Laughlin developed a plan that would have Texas Guardsmen flying drones as part of OLS which led to the creation of the TX Military Department's Small Unmanned Aircraft System Program with Laughlin as the program's training director. Reporting Hours

You can report hours monthly:

Look at your calendars/phones at all of your hours. If you have not started reporting your volunteer hours this year, now is the time to start. With the new changes, we may now include hours worked as election clerks, election judges, making phone calls and time spent working for candidates as long as you are not employed by them. Don't forget your travel time to and from events, and any preparations for those meetings or events. Our Galveston County GOP Headquarters has been open and will be reopening again soon just a few offices down. Please **don't forget to volunteer and keep a record of your hours spent.** Awards will be given by TFRW and NFRW to members and clubs reporting the most hours.

As a reminder...New Categories for Reporting Hours and what to include:

1. CALLING

Include all calls for any political activities, such as initiatives or ballot questions. Dialing apps will record the number of calls you have made, or you can use your best estimate.

2. POLITICAL HOURS

When in doubt, count the hour and round up to the closest whole hour. Travel time to and from the activity.

Research and development of the activity (Example: Social media posts / letters to the editor). Preparation and breakdown of activity hours collected are on a best estimate basis.

3. **PRIMARY and ASSOCIATE MEMBERS** hours are counted.

All volunteer political activities, whether paid or unpaid (Example: paid election worker or poll watcher), are eligible. *Individuals who are salaried campaign and/or GOP professional staff do not qualify (i.e., those who earn their living by being employed in politics).

EXAMPLES OF ACTIVITIES

- All time spent at Club, Region, State, and National Federation meetings or conventions (in person or virtual).
- All campaign activities benefiting the Federation (TFRW), the Republican Party, or Republican candidates.
- Attendance at all Republican events, including Rallies, Lincoln Day Dinners, even if tickets were purchased for attendance.
- Running for Office (partisan or non-partisan) as a Republican Candidate.
- Walking precincts, preparing letters to the editor or elected officials, any phone calls, radio, TV and social media appearances, posting to social media, voter registration, writing or editing a digital or hardcopy club newsletter, attendance at rallies.
- Working on any aspect of a Republican campaign (partisan or non-partisan) .
- Working on Republican ballot questions, initiatives, or petitions.
- Time spent serving as an elected member of your Local, County, State or National Party Committee.
- Attending, preparing for, or volunteering at Club, Region, State, and National Federation meetings or conventions.
- Attending, preparing for, or volunteering at meetings or conventions of the Local, County, State, and National Republican Party or local meetings or conventions.
- Working at a Local, County, State, National Republican office.
- Working at a Local, County, State, National Republican candidate or elected official's office as a volunteer.
- Working as an Election Officer, Poll Watcher, Challenger, or Election Integrity worker.
- All campaign activities benefiting our Republican Party, candidates, and/or the Federation (TFRW).
- Time spent making political and campaign calls.
- Any other political or campaign activities.

2022 Texas GOP Priorities

These priorities were chosen by over 5,000 voting delegates at the state convention, June 13-18, 2022 in Houston, Texas. Delegates were presented with a <u>list of 15 topics selected by the Legislative Priorities Committee</u> after a comprehensive review of resolutions passed at the precinct and senate district levels of the convention process. Delegates were allowed to vote on 8 topics, which became the official Legislative Priorities of the Republican Party of Texas.

1. Protect our Elections:

Restore felony penalties and enact civil penalties for Election Code violations, which shall be enforceable by any Texas jurisdiction, including the Texas Attorney General. Require citizenship verification of each voter. Restrict the distribution of mail-in ballots to only disabled, military, and citizens that are out of state. Reduce the time allowed for early voting, and eliminate the three-day gap between early voting and election day. Establish closed primaries in Texas. As technology evolves, we encourage the passage of legislation that ensures the security of our elections.

2. Secure the Border and Protect Texans:

Texas shall immediately deny all taxpayer funded services and subsidies to illegal aliens. We call upon the Governor to assert his duty under Article 1, Section 10, Clause 3 of the US Constitution to declare an invasion on our Texas border and do everything in his power to protect Texans from this invasion. The legislature shall direct the Governor to enter into an Interstate Compact with one or more states for Border Security.

3. Ban Gender Modification of Children:

Texas must ban chemical castration, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, genital mutilation, bodily alteration surgery, psychological/social transitioning, and any other methods applied to or performed on children.

4. Stop Sexualizing Texas Kids:

Repeal Texas Penal Code "Obscenity Exemption" 43.24(c), which allows children access to harmful, explicit, or pornographic materials and 43.25(f)(2 3), which allows sexual performance by a child. In addition, prohibit teaching, exposure, and/or discussion of sexual matters (mechanics, feelings, orientation, or "gender identity" issues), and prohibit use or provision of related books and other materials using criminal, civil or other enforcement measures.

5. Ban Democrat Chairs:

To ensure all legislative Republican priorities are given a fair opportunity to become law, the Republican-controlled Texas legislature shall adopt a rule that would end the practice of awarding committee chairmanships to Democrats.

6. Abolish Abortion in Texas:

Abolish abortion by ensuring the right to life and equal protection of the laws to all preborn children from the moment of fertilization, including adopting effective tools to ensure the enforcement of our laws to protect life when district attorneys fail to do so.

7. Defend Our Gun Rights:

Protect our gun rights against threats, such as red flag laws, federal, state or other restrictions, by strengthening and preserving our inalienable rights under the second amendment to protect our life, liberty and property. The Texas Legislature should eliminate gun-free zones.

8. Parental Rights and Educational Freedom:

Parents are the primary decision makers for their children in all matters. This authority shall be protected as an inalienable right. This shall include the choice of schooling where the money follows the child without strings attached, and enforcement and penalty mechanisms when parents' rights are violated. The right to education shall be free from any social theories.
